

Operation Iron Ruck

This past November, on the day before Thanksgiving, ADVA Claims Analyst Lyle Rountree and Claims Division Support Administrator Paula Lawson rucked the first three miles of Operation Iron Ruck which began at the Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.


Operation Iron Ruck (OIR) is an annual event hosted by the Auburn Student Veterans Association (ASVA) and the University of Alabama Student Veterans of America (SVA) to raise awareness and funds for Veteran suicide prevention.

In 2018, Operation Iron Ruck was founded when student veterans from Auburn University and the University of Alabama decided they wanted to help their fellow veterans. Each Iron Bowl since, student veterans, veteran alumni and ROTC from both Auburn and Alabama embark on a 151-mile ruck starting at the away team's stadium and ending at the home team's stadium. The ruckers also carry the game ball to the home team's stadium ahead of each Iron Bowl.

"As the state of Alabama has one of the nation's highest Veteran suicide rates, OIR seeks to increase the public's knowledge on this issue while uniting Veterans with the community, funding charities, championing Veteran suicide education and supporting local Veteran organizations."

ADVA Commissioner Finalizes Land Contract for New State Veterans Cemetery in North Alabama

New State Veterans Cemetery Land Contract

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) is advancing a new state veterans cemetery in North Alabama after Commissioner Jeff Newton signed a contract Thursday securing property in Madison County.

"The new state veterans cemetery will be a lasting and meaningful impact on Alabama's 400,000 veterans, and Governor Kay Ivey's continued support has been instrumental in making this important investment a reality," Commissioner Newton said. "This facility is another example of how Alabama takes care of its veterans, retirees, traditional Guardsmen, Reservists, and spouses."

The finalized contract comes several weeks after ADVA received authorization for federal grant funding from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to support the development. The grant of \$13.5 million

is dependent upon receipt of compliance documentation.

The new cemetery, which will be located east of Huntsville on Maysville Road NE, will serve a majority of the 42,709 unserved veterans in Alabama who do not live within 75 miles of a state or federal veterans cemetery. The facility, which will serve the region's veterans for many decades to come, will include ground crypts, traditional graves, columbarium niches, and a scatter garden, along with a committal shelter and administrative building.
